SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS



1. TITLE AND NATURE OF THE EVENT

The event is entitled the HUNTER RIVMASTA OFF ROAD 200 WARIALDA (herein after called the Event), being the **6th Round of NSW Off Road Championship**, and the Premier Long Course Round 3.

It will be conducted at the private property 'Monomeeth' approximately 7kms from Warialda on the Gragin Road on the 21st & 22nd September 2013.

The event is a Long Course Off Road Event run in an anti-clockwise direction over a variety of surfaces, it is designed to test driver's skill and preparation during daylight hours.

The Prologue is approximately 5kms in length and the Full Course is approximately 200kms in length.

2. AUTHORITY AND PERMIT

The Event will be conducted under the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA and the National Competition Rules of CAMS, the Off Road Standing Regulations for the Long Course events, the NSW Off Road Championship Sporting Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any further Regulations which may be issued. Where these regulations differ from the Standing Regulations, these regulations will take precedence. Any final instructions that may be issued will have the same force as these regulations subject to NCR's 69 & 89. The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au and will be displayed at Event Headquarters.

6.3 Passes (Wrist Bands):

Will be supplied to **Competitors, Driver's, Navigator's or Pit Crews, a minimum requirement to be marked with the Competition Number and Name written on the wrist band. Wrist bands MUST be worn at all times.**

These passes will permit access to the Pits Area whilst racing is in progress.

Each Competitor will be allocated four (4) passes - two (2) Competitor Passes and two (2) Pit Passes, or unless single seaters, then it will be, one (1) Competitor Pass and three (3) Pit Passes

Additional Navigators may compete, providing they are properly nominated and have signed the Entry Forms and an additional Navigators fee is paid.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 83.

7. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

7.1 All vehicles described in CAMS Manual under OFF ROAD Standing Regulations, to the OFF ROAD - General Requirements for Off Road Vehicles, GR1 to GR30 plus GR36 and OFF ROAD VEHICLES – Specific Requirements for Off Road Vehicles, SR1 to SR4.13.

For current specification refer to www.camsmanual.com.au Refer to current CAMS Standing Regulations

Vehicles will be classified as follows:

- Pro Buggy:** Buggies with engines over 1650cc and not exceeding 6000cc for petrol engines or 7200cc for diesel engines
- Prolite Buggy:** Buggies with engines up to 3500cc, naturally-aspirated
- Super 1650cc Buggy:** Buggies with engines up to 1650cc
- Sportsman Buggy:** Buggies with engines not exceeding 1330cc
- Performance 2WD:** Modified 2WD with engines not exceeding 6000cc for petrol engines or 7200cc for diesel engines.
- UTV:** Production based 4wd, 2 seat off road Recreational vehicles up to 1200cc
- Extreme 2WD:** Highly-modified 2WD with engines not exceeding 6000cc for petrol Engines or 7200cc for diesel engines. Includes Baja.
- Production 4WD:** Production 4WD with engines not exceeding 6000cc for petrol engines or 7200cc for

diesel engines

Extreme 4WD: Highly-modified 4WD with engines not exceeding 6000cc for petrol engines or 7200cc for diesel engines

All of the previous sizes must include any correctional factors for forced induction or rotary engines.

7.2 Maximum noise emission of 95db (A) at thirty (30) metres will be measured and enforced. Any vehicle that does not and cannot comply can be excluded from the Event. This is the maximum allowed by the Circuit owners, the Promoting Club and **THE GWYDIR SHIRE COUNCIL**. OFF ROAD Standing Regulations. SR 4.5

7.3 CAMS **AORC** allocated number will be given preference over all other state numbers. Ref to www.camsmanual.com.au

7.4 Note CAMS Manual:

- a. Seat belt cutters, warning triangles and 5 metre tow ropes
- b. Compulsory CAMS logo to be affixed to all competitor vehicles
- c. Floor plates should be a minimum thickness of 1.5mm steel or 2.0mm aluminium fixed with a minimum of 6mm bolts or ¼ turn dzus or similar.
- d. Off road padding minimum specifications SF1 45.1. From 01/01/2014 (B13.069)

7.5 All competition vehicles must start every Section of the Event with all their panels attached, unless they have been damaged and can no longer be attached. Chief scrutineer to check claims that they are damaged, and any vehicle at the starting line without all their panels will be sent back to attach them and their time will be taken from when they should have started.

7.6 The Race number is required on the windscreen/sun visor on buggies to assist marshals on the start line. Numbers to be at least 70mm high in contrasting colours (see GR36).

8 CREW ELIGIBILITY

8.1 Points will only be awarded once per vehicle entered, (to the nominated number 1 driver) but there may be more than one driver.

8.2 **AN UNAUTHORISED PERSON IN A RACE VEHICLE IS PROHIBITED.**

8.3 Crew changes will be permitted, but only with crew already entered in the Event before the race meeting starts and with the Event Secretary's/Clerk of the Course's permission and all paperwork completed.

8.4 At least one member of each crew must hold a valid civil drivers licence, and/or be at least 18 years of age. Proof of age required.

8.5 All crew shall wear apparel that complies with Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

9 MINIMUM AGE

Minimum Age to be in Pits is 16 as per NSW Dept. Of Sport & Recreation rules. (navigators under this age may only be in pit area when they are entering/exiting vehicles).

9.1 Driver and Co-Driver Minimum 16 years of age and Navigator minimum 14 years of age

9.2 One crew must be at least 18 years of age and/or hold a valid civil licence.

10 LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

NO, NOS, NON, NONJ, NONSE (Single Event Navigator), NOSE (Single Event Driver)

11 SCRUTINY

SCRUTINY and BIENNIAL INSPECTIONS; (CAMS OFF ROAD STANDING REGULATIONS SR 4.7)

If you wish to compete in any Off Road Event

a) A Biennial Inspection must have been successfully carried out within the prior two years,
Or

b) For a vehicle which is less than two years old produce a current logbook.

All Vehicles MUST have a current CAMS Log Book and be presented at Scrutiny.

12 SAFETY

All Competitors MUST comply with the current National Competition Rules of CAMS. Refer to www.camsmanual.com.au

- 12.1 All Drivers and Navigators must wear helmets approved by CAMS and bearing a standards mark as set out in Manual. OFF ROAD Standing Regulations 3, 5 (i) ATTIRE Schedule D.

13 PIT REFUELLING AND HOT WORK AREA

- 13.1 **ALL REFUELLING during the course of the competition MUST BE DONE IN** the Refuelling Bay. **Conditions of Refuelling see the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport** (Ref 4.6 Par i, ii, iii).
- 13.2 **All persons involved in refuelling operations, or within two metres of refuelling or venting Points whilst the vehicle is being refuelled, are to** wear the correct attire of a minimum attire of at least shoes and non – flammable socks and clothing from waist to neck to ankle, and have the minimum of extinguisher as set out in the CAMS Manual. Refer to Standing Regulation 13 – 13.2 SAFETY and General Requirements 2 – 2.1 SAFETY
- 13.3 **ALL WELDING, OPEN FLAMES and GRINDING must occur in the HOT WORK AREA located in the Pits.** (OFF ROAD Standing Regulations 13.5)
- 13.4 **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES is any welding, grinding, etc, permitted outside of the HOT AREA.** *Any competitor who does so will be excluded from the competition and asked to leave the venue.*
- 13.5 **FUEL must comply with Schedule G of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.**

14 COMPETITION RULES

- 14.1 Any vehicle that misses its allocated heat will not be permitted to start in another heat in that Round and will be given a Did Not Start (DNS).
- 14.2 A vehicle that arrives to the start after its schedule starting time, will only be allowed to start after the last car in that group has left the starting line, provide it does not impede the progress of the

following row of cars. The elapsed time begins on the original schedule starting time.

- 14.3** Competitors unable to make the start may be given 2 minutes to do so if it is applied for before the first car in that heat starts.
- 14.4** A competitor may return to the pits during a race through the NORMAL RETURN TO PIT point, and if rejoining that particular race must do so through the Start line access when the starter permits.
- 14.5** **The course may close at 2:30pm on Sunday the 22nd, at the director's discretion.**
- 14.6** **Competition vehicles that are not road registered, shall not be driven or flat towed on a Public Road.**
- 14.7** **Smoking will not be permitted** in the pits or in race vehicles at any time during competition.
- 14.8** **During any event, consumption of alcoholic beverages in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition venue under the control of the officials is expressly forbidden until all practice or competition activity is concluded for each day. Any driver or crew member who is found to be affected by alcohol on the day of the event or practice therefore shall not be permitted to participate. Refer NCR 145A of the Current CAMS Manual. In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Standard Operating Procedure for Alcohol Testing and CAMS Anti-Doping Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be randomly tested for alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) or other drugs at any time during the event(s). The CAMS Anti Doping Policy, as appears in the CAMS Manual of Motorsports and as amended from time to time, is recognised as an integral component of the NCR and is duly authorised as such. In any areas where the National Competition Rules and the CAMS Anti Doping Policy conflict, the CAMS Anti Doping Policy will take precedence**

15 NSW OFF ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP CONDITIONS

This can be contested by any CAMS National Off Road Licence holder who is registered for this series prior to the commencement of racing. (OFF ROAD Standing Regulation 3.3-iii complying with 3.1) See the NSW ORC Sporting Regulations referring to the conditions required to gain points. Registration is FREE and only needs to be done once annually.

- 15a NSW Premier Long Course Series Regulations can be found on the Kempsey and Hunter Off Road Websites.
Entry into this series automatically occurs just by entering any of the three series events.

16 DETERMINATION OF THE WINNER OF THIS NSWORC ROUND

The Competitor that completes the most distance in the least time (including Penalty time) is the winner. The Results will be declared 30 minutes after the last race UNLESS a protest has been lodged. If a protest has been lodged, the results will be declared after the protest has been dealt with.

17 AWARDS

The following Trophies will be awarded at the completion of the event.

- *Trophies will be awarded to Drivers and Navigators 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each Class plus*
- *Outrights winners 1st, 2nd and 3rd*
- Fastest Prologue
- Best Presented Car (donated by MTY Trophies)
- Fastest Long Lap (donated by M & K Eveleigh Plant & Equipment Hire)
- First Local Home (donated by The Rose Family)
- First Lady Home

18 TIMING AND START LIGHTS/FLAG

- 18.1 Timing officials will be deemed Judge of Fact.
- 18.2 Timing begins when the signal to start is given and/or when the lights turns green.
- 18.3 Times to one hundredth of a second will be taken on every lap and every lap within the time allowed will be counted.
- 18.4 A competitor's score shall be the driver elapsed time total for all heats, passing through all controls.
- 18.5 Competitors are reminded that there is no right to protest against the decision of a Judge of Fact (NCR205)
- 18.6 Competitors will be started with a maximum of 20, rows of 2 cars at a minimum of 30 seconds apart.

19 TIME and ALLOWANCES

- 19.1 The time limit set for "Short Course" race, shall be 30 minutes from the start time of the race in which you are in.
- 19.2 *The "Long Course" race no car shall start time after 1hour from your start time allotted. The finish line closes 2 hours after your start time of the Long Course race.*

20 STOPPAGES and REGROUPING

- 20.1 Vehicles causing heat stoppages will be restarted at the rear of the field. Regrouping maybe carried out at the Directors discretion. Regrouping will be done after section 2.
- 20.2 You will be required to supply your own INCIDENT STATIS SIGN FOR LONG COURSE RACES. This will be explained at the drivers briefing.

21 COURSE MARKERS

The course is marked as per Standing Regulations for Short and Long Course Off Road Events.

22 RECONNAISSANCE

- 22.1 ONLY the nominated driver with crew will be allowed to reconnoitre the course at a **NON – COMPETITIVE SPEED**. Nominated Vehicles will leave first followed by registered vehicles.
- 22.2 Any Competitor deemed to be driving in a manner not complying with the instructions may be excluded from the Event.
- 22.3 All Crew members must wear the current approved attire and be strapped in as if for racing.
- 22.4 Reconnaissance of the Short Course will be on Saturday 21st September from 10.00am and Reconnaissance of the Long Course will be Saturday 21st at the completion of Saturdays heats, time to be advised.
- 22.5 **Further instructions will be given at Crews briefing to be held at the Track at 9:30am Saturday and 8.00am Sunday morning.**

23 PROLOGUE

- 23.1 Prologue will be run over one lap of the shorter course after the completion of reconnaissance.
- 23.2 Vehicles will be started singly at 1 minute intervals. The prologue order will be announced at Saturday morning drivers briefing.
- 23.3 Starting order will be determined by the time lost in the Compulsory Prologue.

24 PENALTIES

As per Part 19 and 11.2 of the Off Road Standing Regulations, but the following penalties are brought to your attention:

- 24.1 JUMPING THE START 1 minute
If repeated or blatant breaking of the start, exclusion. All wheels must be stationery until starting order is given.
- 24.2 DELIBERATE SHORT CUTTING or deviation from the course, other than missing control/s, will be 3 Minutes per offence.
- 24.3 DANGEROUS DRIVING (as determined by the Stewards) Exclusion
- 24.4 DELIBERATE INTERFERENCE with or impeding other competitors a 3 minutes per offence. Additional penalties may be given by the stewards.
- 24.5 UNAUTHORISED TOWING for more than 400 metres on any one lap – can be excluded.
- 24.6 FAILURE TO ATTEND BRIEFING: Five (5) Minute per offence.
- 24.7 Additional penalties may be given by the Stewards.

25 PROTEST

1. Protests may only be made in the appropriate manner as outlined in the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport NCR Part XII.
2. A Competitors Liaison Officer/Competitors Relations Officer will be available
3. A condition of entry is that the track can be watered at the discretion of the Promoters and no protests will be accepted on this action, or of timing, Regrouping and Heat Order.

26 GENERAL

- 26.1 **Course Officials and Timing Officials** will be deemed “Judges of Fact” of any racing incident.
- 26.2 **Wrist bands** - will only be supplied to Competitors and Crew, will be marked with Name and Competition number and **MUST** be worn at all times.
- 26.3 **Official** may be supplied with a wrist band or an Official Passes that is to be worn on the outer of clothing at all times.
- 26.4 **Pit Areas** all persons associated with a vehicle **must have signed on and be wearing the appropriate wristband to enter the pits**. If any person that is not wearing the correct wristband they shall be asked to leave the Pit Area by an Official. Must be a minimum of 16 years of age or 14 years if they are a navigator.
- 26.5 **Pit crews** must be at least wearing correct attire. Eg. Minimum - Polo Shirts, cargo shorts, closed in shoes.
- 26.6 **All Competing vehicles** must be located in the designated pit area during the Event and must service from this area **ONLY**. Refer to current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport – Off Road Standing Regulations (SR 14 – 14.2(i) Paddock Area)
- 26.7 If there is an **URGENT** need for service vehicle in the pit area permission must be sought from Clerk of Course.
- 26.8 **During competition**, any vehicle which leaves the pits, other than to rejoin the event or to go to a designated refuelling area, **will be deemed to have withdrawn from the event**. Unless permission is sought from the Clerk of the Course. Refer to current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport - Off Road Standing Regulations (SR14 – 14.3 Pit).
- 26.9 **At the completion of the day’s competition** NO vehicles other than officials involved in recovery and final sweep are to be on the Course.
- 26.10 **No person** are allowed on the course without permission of the Clerk of Course
- 26.11 **Vehicle testing** the Organising Committee will not allow vehicle testing on access roads or in the Pit Area at any time. This may bring exclusion from the Event.
- 26.12 **Medical Facilities** will be provided by Beneficial Safety Pty Ltd.
- 26.13 **Recovery Vehicles** shall recover competition vehicles after each group, or at the Clerk of Course direction. Any competitor that needs to be towed by other vehicle (other than an Official Vehicle provided by the Organiser) will need permission from the Clerk of

Course.

26.14 A condition of entry is that the track can be watered at the discretion of the Promoters and no Protest will be accepted on this action, or Timing, Regrouping and Heat Order.

26.15 Pits will be open to Spectators during lunch break. All children under 10 years of age MUST have adult supervision.

27 INSURANCE

For details of CAMS Insurance provisions please refer to Appendix 1 of the current CAMS Manual.

28 POSTPONED, ABANDMENT or CANCELLATION

The Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the Event in accordance with NCR 59.

29 CATERING

Catering will be provided at the track throughout the weekend, for **breakfast and lunch**.

30 CAMPING

THERE WILL BE NO CAMPING AT THE TRACK. A designated camping area will be made available in Warialda free of charge.
