Round 5 – 2019 Mickey Thompson Tires AORRA Queensland Off Road Racing Championship

### Supplementary Regulations

#### 1. TITLE AND NATURE OF THE EVENT

The event is entitled the **Albins ARB Goondiwindi 400** (herein after called the event) being Round 2 of the **ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship** and Round 5 of the **Mickey Thompson Tires AORRA Queensland Off Road Racing Championship**.

The event will be conducted on private property approximately 36 km east of Goondiwindi, Queensland on the 16<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

The event is an Off Road Racing Endurance event run over a variety of surfaces and is designed to test the drivers' skill and vehicle preparation during daylight hours.

The **Albins ARB Goondiwindi 400** event prologue is approximately 8 kilometres in length and the full course is approximately 400kms, comprising 5 laps of the 80km course for ARB AORRC competitors and 240kms comprising 3 laps (sections 1 and 2) of the 80km course for QORRC competitors.

#### 2. AUTHORITY AND PERMIT

The event will be held under the National Competition Rules of the Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Pty Ltd (AASA), the Off Road Racing Regulations for AASA and Series Regulations of ARB Australian Off Road Racing Series, these Supplementary Regulations, any Further Regulations, and any Bulletins issued.

The Event is authorised by AASA Permit No AASA160819/GMSA4033.

#### 6. ENTRY DETAILS

Entries are limited to 100 and acceptance will be determined in order of receipt.

Entries open 9:00am Thursday 25th July 2019 and close at midnight on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

Entries received by midnight Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> August 2019 will incur fees of:

- **\$550** ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship (5 laps)
- **\$350** Mickey Thompson Tires AORRA Queensland Off Road Racing Championship (3 Laps)

Entries received from midnight 4<sup>th</sup> August to midnight 11<sup>th</sup> August 2019 will incur an additional **\$100** premium fee and these entries may not be included in printed event documents.

**Entries withdrawn before 5pm Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> August by notification to the Event Secretary will receive a full refund.**

**Names for pit crew MUST be entered and paid for with your entry form.** The nominated names can be changed up until 8pm FRIDAY, 16<sup>th</sup> August. After this time, no changes can be made to your pit crew. There will be **NO extra** pit passes available Saturday or Sunday. All passes are to be signed for and picked up at Friday Night Scrutineering. If your crew won't be arriving until Saturday, they are expected to pay at the main gate and will be refunded their money upon presentation of their entry ticket at Event Headquarters.

Each Competitor will be allocated 7 passes:

- Two Seat Vehicles – 3 Competitor Passes and 4 Pit Passes, or
- Single Seat Vehicles – 1 Competitor Pass and 6 Pit Passes

Additional Pit Passes will be \$10 and additional Navigators passes will be available at \$20.

All entries must be made on the official Online Entry Form and must be accompanied by the requisite entry fee; a link to the online entry can be found on the events page at [offroadracing.com.au](http://offroadracing.com.au)

Payment can be made via EFT or credit card. **Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by the relevant payment at time of entry.**

The organizers reserve the right to refuse, or if deemed appropriate the Clerk of Course may withdraw any entry on the ground of safety, misconduct or inappropriate behaviour.

The organizers reserve the right to abandon, cancel or postpone the event if less than 35 entries are received by close of entries or adverse weather.

## **7. SCRUTINY AND DOCUMENTATION**

### **Goondiwindi Showgrounds - Friday 16<sup>th</sup> August 4pm – 8pm**

Vehicles will be required to be displayed at the Showgrounds until at least 8pm. The Clerk of Course will advise when vehicles can be moved. Competitors will be allocated a documentation and scrutiny time which will be published after close of entries.

No glass is permitted at the scrutiny venue. Alcohol and or smoking is not permitted inside the Scrutiny shed.

All competitors must bring the following documents to documentation:

- Vehicle Passports/Log Books
- Competition Licence
- Proof of Current Car Club Membership
- Proof of Age for under 18 years
- Civil Drivers Licence (where required)
- Third Party Extension (if QLD Road Registered Vehicle)

All entered competitors, co-drivers, navigators and pit crew must sign the relevant disclaimers at Event Headquarters during documentation.

Vehicle Passports/Log Books will be retained at Event Headquarters until the completion of competition and return of the timing transponder for that vehicle.

## 8. RUNNING DETAILS

### 8.1 Reconnaissance

Refer to Event Time Schedule for reconnaissance of the Prologue and Enduro course times.

ONLY one road registered vehicle per entry will be allowed to reconnoitre the course at a **NON – COMPETITIVE SPEED**

Only 1 lap of the Enduro Course and 1 lap of the Prologue course is permitted.

Any competitor deemed to be driving in a manner not complying with the instructions may be excluded from the event.

All vehicle occupants must be wearing a seat belt.

### 8.2 Competing Crew Briefing

A single competing crew briefing will be held on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August at 8:15am with sign-on from 8:00am. **It is compulsory for all competing crew to attend and to have signed on prior to the start of briefing.**

All competing crews will be required to sign-on on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August between 7:00am and 7:15am and, if required, will be issued with event bulletins.

### 8.3 Prologue

A prologue to determine the start order for Section 1 will be run over one lap of the prologue course at starting at 10:30am on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August.

Competitors will start in an order advised by the organisers on the basis of anticipated speeds within class. Prologue start times will be issued prior to the event and will be published on [offroadracing.com.au](http://offroadracing.com.au)

Competitors not finishing the prologue may apply to the organisers to be seeded. The closing time for applications for seeding will be 15 minutes after the completion of the prologue.

As vehicles complete the prologue they will be held on display whilst in the top ten. Vehicles will be released from the display impound when they are knocked out by the prologue time of another competitor. The final top ten will then transfer straight to the top ten shootout with no service.

### 8.4 Top Ten Shootout

The Top Ten Shootout will commence immediately after the completion of the prologue. The top ten fastest cars over the prologue course will run the prologue course again. The results of the shootout will determine the start order for Lap 1. The shootout is compulsory for the ten fastest cars in prologue.

### 8.5 Event

The event will consist of 5 laps of the 80 kilometre course, the surface of which is gravel, dirt and natural surfaces. The event will be conducted over 2 days

Section 1 1 x lap commencing at 2:00pm Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

Section 2 2 x continuous laps commencing at 8:00am Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

All competitors will have a 45 minute service between sections 2 and 3. Competitors must present themselves and their vehicle at their allocated time at the start line where they will be placed into Parc Ferme until the commencement of section 3. Time-in cards will be provided at the completion of section 2 from a location advised at the crew briefing. The time a competitor is due into Parc Ferme will be displayed on the Time-In card. Competitors who fail to present to the Parc Ferme at their prescribed time will have that time added to their total race time.

Section 3 2 x continuous laps commencing at 12:30pm Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

### 8.6 Time Allowed

To be classified as a finisher, a crew shall complete a section within the allowed time as follows:

Section 1: 1 hour 45 minutes

Section 2: 3 hours 30 minutes

Section 3: 3 hours 30 minutes

## 9. TIMING

- 9.1 Timing begins when the signal to start is given.
- 9.2 Times to one thousandths of a second will be recorded on every lap and completed laps within the time allowed will be counted.
- 9.3 A competitor's score shall be the total elapsed time for all laps, passing through controls.
- 9.4 Electronic timing will be used at this event. All competition vehicles will be fitted by the event with a supplied transponder. The transponder must be returned at the completion of competition for the vehicle when the vehicles passbook/log book will be returned to the competitor. If the transponder is not returned at the event, it is the responsibility of the competitor to express post return it to Race Time immediately. If the transponder is lost, destroyed or not returned within three days, a charge of \$450 will be applied. Transponders remain the property of Race Time, but all responsibility is held with the competitor during the event.

## 10. COMPETITION RULES

- 10.1 A vehicle that arrives to the start after its schedule starting time will be allowed to start at the next safe time or at the discretion of the Clerk of Course, provided it does not impede the start of any other competitor. The elapsed time begins on the original schedule starting time.
- 10.2 **Smoking is not permitted** in the pits, anywhere around the course or in race vehicles at any time during competition.
- 10.3 You are required to supply your own INCIDENT STATUS (OK/SOS) sign for Enduro races.

## 11. PROTEST

Protests may be made via the Competitor Relations Officer who will refer to the Clerk of Course. Upon judgement if the competitor is not satisfied a further protest may be lodged with the AASA Stewards along with the appropriate fee.

## 12. ELIGIBILITY

### 12.1 Vehicle Eligibility

Refer to AASA vehicle eligibility criteria and classes for off road racing vehicles.

A small yellow forward facing racing number, at least 70mm high, must be fitted. This is to assist marshals during line up.

Vehicles meeting the current Aust4/Ultra4 vehicle criteria are invited to compete as an invitational class providing they comply with:

- 12.2.1 the Aust4 Racing Series Regulations for Ultra4 vehicle eligibility criteria and safety requirements
- 12.2.2 the current AASA / AORRA competing crew and vehicle safety requirements with particular reference to:
  - Forward facing lights
  - Frontal neck and head restraints
  - Off road vehicle number requirements
    - a roof number and rear number
    - using the numbers 1104 to 1199 (of their choosing)

### 12.3 Competing Crew Eligibility

- 12.3.1 The minimum age for Drivers and Co-Drivers is 14 years of age.
- 12.3.2 One competing crew in the vehicle at all times must be at least 18 years of age and/or hold a valid civil drivers licence.
- 12.3.3 Points will only be awarded once per vehicle entered (to the nominated number 1 driver) but there may be more than one driver.
- 12.3.4 Unauthorized person/s in a race vehicle is prohibited.
- 12.3.5 Crew changes will be permitted during the event as long as the crew have completed documentation before the close of scrutiny and have attended all briefings, and only then with Event Secretary's/Clerk of Course's permission and all paperwork addressed before entering vehicle.

### 12.4 Licences

- 12.4.1 Any crew member between the ages of 14-17 **MUST** hold a current AASA competition licence or AASA single event licence.
- 12.4.2 A current National Level AASA Off Road Racing Competition Licences or approved equivalent is required for this event for competitors 18 years and older.

- 12.4.3 AASA Off Road Racing Navigator State Single Event Licence can be used by competitors competing for the full distance of the event and a AASA Off Road Racing Driver or Navigator Club Single Event Licence can be used by competitors competing in the 3 laps component of the event. These licences can be purchased online at [aasa.com.au](http://aasa.com.au).

### 13. GENERAL

- 13.1 Officials and competitors will be supplied with wristbands or an Official Pass that is to be worn on the outer of clothing at all times.
- 13.2 At the completion of the day's competition, NO vehicles other than officials involved in recovery and final sweep are to be on the course.
- 13.3 No persons are allowed on the course without the permission of the Clerk of Course.
- 13.4 Recovery vehicles shall recover competition vehicles after each competitive section or at the Clerk of Course direction. Any competitor that needs to be towed by another vehicle (other than an official vehicle provided by the organiser) will need permission from the Clerk of Course.
- 13.5 A condition of entry is that the track can be watered at the discretion of the promoters and no protest will be accepted on this action.
- 13.6 Safety  
All Competitors MUST comply with the current AASA Regulations.  
All drivers and Navigators must wear helmets and apparel as per the 2019 AASA Off Road Racing Apparel requirements (Appendix 4).
- 13.7 Refuelling and Hot Work Area
- 13.7.1 ALL REFUELLING at the venue MUST BE DONE IN THE PITS or in the designated refuel lane.  
All persons involved in refuelling operations, or within a **three** metre radius of refuelling or venting point whilst the vehicle is being refuelled, are to wear a minimum of at least covered shoes with non-flammable socks and non-flammable clothing from neck to wrist to ankle, and have the minimum fire extinguisher held at the ready by a person. Refer to Standing Regulations.
- 13.7.2 ALL WELDING, OPEN FLAMES and GRINDING must occur in the HOT WORK AREA.
- 13.7.3 All fuel used in competition vehicles must be commercially available unleaded fuel, or commercially available diesel fuel.
- 13.8 Course Markers  
The course is marked as per the Off Road Racing Standards.
- 13.9 Judges of Fact  
Control Officials, Starters and Timekeepers will be deemed Judges of Fact with regard to whether or not a vehicle follows the prescribed course, relative order, time of arrival, direction of travel, direction of entry into controls, start procedure and jumping the start. Timekeepers and radar operators will be deemed Judge of Fact as to whether a vehicle exceeds speed limit on reconnaissance.  
  
Recovery officials, outriders and control officials will be deemed Judges of Fact with regard to track deviation/course shortening.

### 14 POINTS AND AWARDS

- 14.1 Determination of the Winner  
The competitor (excluding the Aust4/Ultra 4 competitors) that completes the most distance in the least time (including penalty time) is the winner.
- 14.2 ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship  
Points and series regulations will be as per ARB Australian Off Road Racing Championship regulations. Competitors must be registered prior the close of entry for this event to be eligible for series points.
- 14.3 Mickey Thompson Tires AORRA Queensland Off Road Racing Championship  
Points and series regulations will be as per Mickey Thompson Tires AORRA Queensland Off Road Racing Championship regulations.
- 14.4 Awards  
Trophies will be awarded to Driver and Navigators 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in class for the 3 laps Mickey Thompson Tires AORRA Queensland Off Road Racing Championship and 5 laps total event distance.  
  
Please note: Classes will be amalgamated if there are less than three entries in a class.

All awards will be presented at the dinner and prize presentation on Sunday evening. Any teams not attending the Presentation must arrange for their awards to be collected, as trophies will not be posted or delivered.

## **15 PIT AREA**

- 15.1 A pit will be in use for the duration of the event.
- 15.2 Service Crew whilst in the pit area must be wearing the minimum attire of t-shirt, cargo shorts and closed shoes.
- 15.3 Smoking or the consumption of alcohol is not permitted in the pit or hot work area.
- 15.4 The pit area will be clearly signed and fenced.
- 15.5 Entry in and out of pit must be via the designated entry and exit point/s.
- 15.6 The maximum permitted speed is 20km/hour
- 15.7 Only tow vehicles, trailers and transport vehicles will be allowed in the pit. Competition vehicles are allowed in the pit area outside of competition times and during the service break.
- 15.8 All competition vehicles must be serviced in the pit area.
- 15.9 During competition, any vehicle which leaves the pit other than to re-join the event, or go to hot work area will be deemed to have withdrawn from the event unless permission is sought from the Clerk of Course. Breaches of any of these regulations may be referred to the Clerk of Course, which may result in a penalty.

## **16 DRUGS AND ALCOHOL**

- 16.1 Consumption of alcoholic liquor by drivers, navigators or pit crew is forbidden prior to the completion of the meeting in accordance with Schedule 3 of the NCRs. All drivers must not have a BAC exceeding 0.01.
- 16.2 All competitors, navigator, crew and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition.
- 16.3 Any driver, navigator or crew member or official found to be under the influence of alcohol or recreational drugs during the event will be excluded from the event, and further penalties may be imposed in accordance with the NCRs.

## **17 INSURANCE**

AASA Public Liability and Personal Accident Insurance will be provided for Competitors, Competing Crew, nominated Service Crew, Officials and Property Owners.

## **18 PROMOTIONAL / MEDIA ACTIVITY**

A promotional/media passenger in vehicle activity will be conducted at the time/s detailed in the Event Schedule, in accordance with the following criteria:

### **18.1 General**

The promotional activity (invited Media and Sponsors rides) will consist of 1 lap of the modified/shortened prologue track with vehicles starting at 1 minute intervals. There will be a maximum of two vehicles on the track at any one time.

Vehicles must not exceed approximately 75% of full competition speed and all passengers will be required to sign the appropriate disclaimer.

If involved in an incident/accident during such activity, the driver shall be subject to an inquiry by the Stewards of the Event who will examine the circumstances of that incident and determine whether due and appropriate care was taken during the activity.

This activity is not a competition and therefore will not be timed nor be subject to any awards.

### **18.2 Eligibility**

Only the competition cars and drivers nominated by the event are eligible for this activity.

Only the invited sponsors and media will be eligible for the rides and as a passenger only.

Passengers must sign a disclaimer which will be available from Event Headquarters, then will be allocated an armband.

## **19 MISCELLANEOUS**

Full canteen facilities will be available Friday night at the showground and Saturday and Sunday at the event headquarters.

**ABSOLUTELY NO CAMPING IS PERMITTED ON ANY PROPERTIES OF THE RACE CIRCUIT.**
